"At the mall we shop, see friends and sometimes even eat out at one of the restaurants. Besides, I want to see what I'm getting before I decide to buy something. I can't do that if I buy online. When you go to a walk-in store, you can touch the item, try it on or try it out. Also," she says, "I like to get personal help, a salesperson can give **personalized service**, showing you how to use new or unfamiliar electronic item such as a tablet or e-book reader.
